KNOW YOUR RIGHTS!

AT HOME

- 01** **Do not open your door.** Reduce risk to yourself. If an immigration agent is at your door, confirm their identity by asking for a badge or ID through a window. Ask them to show a warrant signed by a judge by passing under the door. If they don't have one, do not open the door. They may try to pressure or trick you, but stay firm and calm.
- 02** **Remain silent.** You are not required to answer any questions about your immigration status. Say: "I am exercising my right to remain silent." Repeat if necessary. You are protected under the 5th Amendment rights under the U.S. Constitution.
- 03** **Do not sign anything without talking to a lawyer.** You have the right to a lawyer; do not sign anything that could jeopardize your case.
- 04** **If ICE enters without permission, do not resist.** If you wish to exercise your rights, state: "I do not consent to your entry or to your search of these premises. I am exercising my right to remain silent. I wish to speak with a lawyer as soon as possible."
- 05** **Make a plan with your family.** Identify a safe contact person, memorize important phone numbers, and have a plan for who will take care of children or loved ones in case of detention.

AT WORK

- 01** **You do not have to answer questions about your immigration status.** Stay calm and say: "I do not wish to answer that question."
- 02** **If ICE or police come to your workplace: Stay where you are and do not run.** Ask if you are free to leave. If yes, walk away calmly.
- 03** **Your employer or colleagues should not share your personal information with ICE without a court order.**

JUDICIAL WARRANTS v. IMMIGRATION WARRANTS

ADMINISTRATIVE/IMMIGRATION WARRANT

DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY
WARRANT OF REMOVAL/DEPORTATION

To any immigration officer of the United States Department of Homeland Security, or any other officer authorized to serve process on behalf of the United States, who entered the United States at:

1. The immigration officer of the United States has the power and authority vested in the Secretary of Homeland Security under the laws of the United States to remove or deport me from the United States, the alien consents to removal, and I have agreed to be removed from the United States under the laws of the United States.

2. An immigration judge is included, deportation, or removal proceedings are being conducted before the Board of Immigration Appeals, or the United States Court of Appeals for the Circuit, or the United States Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit, or the Supreme Court of the United States.

These are visual cues that this is an immigration warrant

STAMPED

Judicial Warrant: Allows ICE to enter/search your home
Administrative/Immigration Warrant: Does NOT allow ICE to enter or search your home

AT SCHOOL

- 01** **Every child has the right to go to school, no matter their immigration status.** Public schools cannot ask for a Social Security number, green card, or visa.
- 02** **Under federal law, schools cannot turn over identifiable student records to police, federal agents, or immigration officials without the written consent of a parent or guardian, unless the information is requested through subpoena or court order.**

DETAINED NEAR THE BORDER BY BORDER PATROL

- Within 100 miles of the border, Border Patrol has extra authority, but you still have rights.
- **Stay calm and do not run** if stopped by Border Patrol. Do not lie or provide false information.
- You do not have to answer questions about your immigration status. If an agent asks, say: "*I choose to remain silent.*"
- **Border Patrol cannot arrest you without probable cause.** They must have facts proving you likely committed a violation. You do not have to allow a search of your car or belongings unless they have probable cause.
- **Do not sign anything without a lawyer.**

HOW ALLIES CAN HELP

- **Be a witness.** If you see ICE at someone's home or workplace, take notes, record (if safe), photograph the scene, and request agent identification. Also, try to get the immigrant's name and contact information to connect them with legal support.
- **Know the signs of an ICE raid.** Share verified information and report raids using the Rural AZ Hotline (520-607-0507) or Puente AZ Hotline (480-506-7437).
- **Help families make emergency plans.** Offer to be a contact person or provide resources.
- **Advocate for immigrant rights.** Speak up against discrimination, share Know Your Rights information, and push for local policies that protect immigrants.

EN CASA

- 01** **No abra la puerta. Reduzca su riesgo.** Si un agente de inmigración toca su puerta, confirme su identidad pidiéndole una placa o identificación a través de una ventana. Pídale que muestre una orden judicial firmada por un juez por debajo de la puerta. Si no la tiene, no abra la puerta. Puede que intenten presionarte o engañarte, pero mantente firme y tranquilo.
- 02** **Guarde silencio.** No está obligado a responder ninguna pregunta sobre su estatus migratorio. Diga: "Estoy ejerciendo mi derecho a guardar silencio". Repita si es necesario. Está protegido por los derechos de la Quinta Enmienda de la Constitución de los Estados Unidos.
- 03** **No firme nada sin consultar a un abogado.** Tiene derecho a un abogado; no firme nada que pueda poner en riesgo su caso.
- 04** **Si ICE entra sin permiso, no se resista.** Si desea ejercer sus derechos, indique: "No doy permiso para que entren ni revisen esta propiedad. Estoy ejerciendo mi derecho a permanecer en silencio. Deseo hablar con un abogado lo antes posible."
- 05** **Haga un plan con su familia.** Identifique a una persona de confianza para que sea su contacto de emergencia. Memorice números de teléfonos importantes y asegúrense de tener un plan sobre quién cuidará a los niños o seres queridos en caso de una detención.



EN EL TRABAJO

- 01** **No tiene que responder preguntas sobre su estatus migratorio.** Mantenga la calma y diga: "No deseo responder esa pregunta".
- 02** **Si la migra o la policía llegan a su lugar de trabajo: Quédese donde está y no corra.** Pregunte si puede irse. Si es así, aléjese con calma.
- 03** **Su empleador o colegas no deben compartir su información personal con ICE sin una orden judicial.**



EN LA ESCUELA

- 01** **Todo niño tiene derecho a ir a la escuela, sin importar su estatus migratorio.** Las escuelas públicas no pueden solicitar un número de Seguro Social, una tarjeta de residencia permanente o visas.
- 02** **Según la ley federal, las escuelas no pueden entregar registros identificables de estudiantes a la policía, agentes federales o oficiales de inmigración sin el consentimiento por escrito de un parent o tutor, a menos que la información se solicite mediante citación u orden judicial.**

SI TE DETIENE LA PATRULLA FRONTERIZA CERCA DE LA FRONTERA

- Dentro de un radio de 100 millas de la frontera, la Patrulla Fronteriza tiene autoridad adicional, pero usted todavía tiene derechos.
- **Mantenga la calma y no corra** si lo detiene la Patrulla Fronteriza. No mienta ni dé información falsa.
- No tiene que responder preguntas sobre su estatus migratorio. Si un agente le pregunta, diga: "Elijo guardar silencio".
- **La Patrulla Fronteriza no puede arrestarlo sin causa probable.** Deben tener pruebas que demuestren que probablemente cometió un delito o una infracción. No tiene que permitir que revisen su vehículo ni sus pertenencias a menos que exista una causa probable.
- **No firme nada sin un abogado.**

CÓMO PUEDEN AYUDAR LOS ALIADOS

- **Sea testigo.** Si ve a agentes de ICE en la casa o el lugar de trabajo de alguien, tome notas, grabe (si es seguro), fotografíe la escena y solicite la identificación del agente. Además, intente obtener el nombre y la información de contacto del inmigrante para conectarlo con asistencia legal.
- **Conozca las señales de una redada de ICE.** Comparta información verificada y denuncie las redadas a través de la Línea Directa para la Zona Rural de Arizona (520-607-0507) o la Línea Directa de Puente, Arizona (480-506-7437).
- **Ayude a las familias a elaborar planes de emergencia.** Ofrézcase como persona de contacto o proporcione recursos.
- **Defiende los derechos de los inmigrantes.** Alza la voz en contra de la discriminación, comparte información sobre "Conoce tus Derechos" y apoya políticas locales que protejan a las comunidades inmigrantes.
